



 - Encourage action from residents to reduce crime




Crime & Safety

- Overall, Lowry Hill is a low crime area
 - 94% property crime (mostly theft)
 - 6% violent crime



Lowry Hill Crime Stats No cases of homicide nor arson, so not shown below





What Can You Do?

- Do not hesitate. Call 911
 - Renters and homeowners
 - Increased calls = better tracking for areas of crimes, trends, increased patrols
 - Suspicious behavior? Still make the call. If it is not an emergency
 - Say "not an emergency"
 - Wait for operator to say "ok go ahead"

Leave A Light On


- Leave porch lights on front and back.









Thomas Lowry Park

Restoration Plan

- LHNA hires Aune Fernandez Landscape Architects to assess features of Thomas Lowry Park – recommend complete replacement of Seven Pools
- LHNA board considers allocating NRP funds to work on Seven Pools, engages Friends of Thomas Lowry Park Board about idea
- MPRB and the SWCAC release a design option for Thomas Lowry Park that called for removing the water from Seven Pools
- Strong Lowry Hill community reaction against the idea of dry pools filled with sand
- Lowry Hill community votes to spend \$300,000 in NRP funds on restoration Seven Pools
- FTLP agrees to spearhead a fundraising campaign to help MPRB replace the almost century old pools.





 - All clear


Aerial attack on Lowry Hill gypsy moth infestation planned for May
